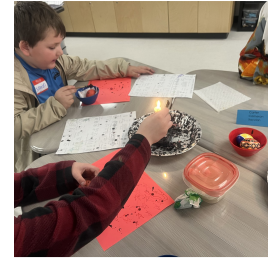

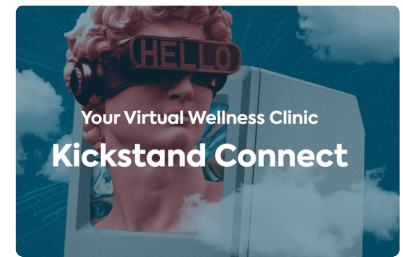

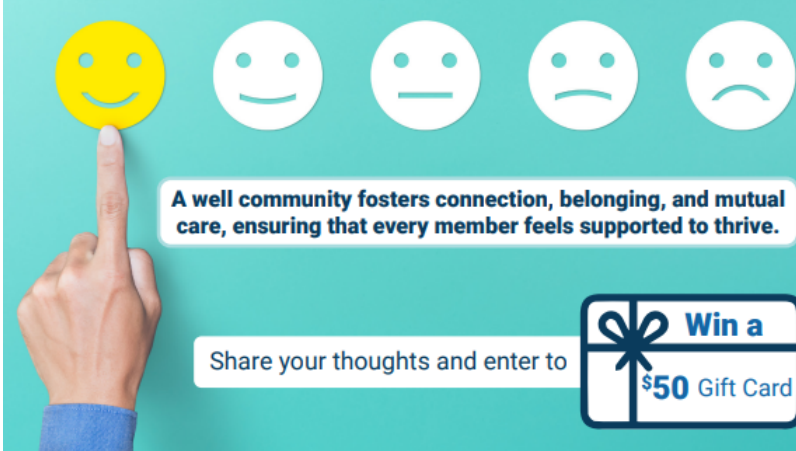

Anderson Boundary Update

The Board of Trustees approved the designation of the Anderson development to Linsford Park School (K-6 English), École Leduc Estates School (Grades K-6 French Immersion), École Leduc Junior High School (Grades 7-9 English and French Immersion), Leduc Composite High School (Grades 10-12 French Immersion) and Ohpaho Secondary School (Grades 10-12 English).

Complexity teams will provide additional support to students and staff, helping ensure safe, supportive learning environments where all students can succeed.

Black Gold's School Board and senior leaders are thankful to students, and parents / caregivers of students, for sharing their insights with the Division - about their experiences receiving additional supports in their learning journeys.
