#### Visible Learning at Black Gold Schools

Black Gold Schools has dedicated Professional Development time for Administrators to implement the work of Dr. John Hattie -Educational Scholar dedicated to the "Visible Learning" model.

What is Visible Learning? Visible learning doesn't happen by accident. It occurs through <u>teaching and learning about learning.</u> For students to understand *what they learn* and *why they learn* and *how they are learning*... that is visible learning! It employs important *metacognitive strategies* where students (and teachers) think about thinking!




How can parents help with the "Visible Learning" model? It is easy! Instead of asking your kids, "What did you learn about today?" and usually that is met with an emphatic, "NOTHING!" Try asking your children a few probing questions like:

- 1. What are you going to learn from this task?
- 2. What do you already know about this?
- 3. What is confusing you?
- 4. How will you get help if get stuck?
- 5. How will you find out if you get it right?

- 6. What will you do when you are frustrated during this learning?
- 7. Do you know what learning strategies you will use?
- 8. Do you know what skills you will use?
- 9. What tools do you need to learn/do this?
- 10. What facts and information do you know that will help you?

Remember, learning isn't about "*just doing the work*" it is about *asking questions*, *doing things again*, and *thinking about it again*.






If you or another member are interested in **coordinating** a group of 10 - 16 students for the **trial** classes, we'll be happy to offer a free 4 class punch card as a thank you!
